
Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Lenten blessings be yours on the Fourth Sunday of Lent! The theme of today's scriptures is to get us to love as God loves us- a tall order. The first reading from the Book of Joshua shows how God now welcomes the Israelites into the Promised Land. Previously their ancestors had lost trust in God and so were denied entry. But now their descendants have been restored in faith and so God's promises can now be enjoyed. "No longer was there manna for the Israelites, who that year ate of the yield of the land of Canaan." Then in 2 Corinthians, Paul emphasizes that it is through Jesus Christ that the bond with God has been restored. Old ways should be put aside to follow the way of the Lord. "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold new things have come." And then in Luke's gospel we have the famous parable of "The Prodigal Son." This story is about one of Luke's favorite themes: forgiveness! He is convinced that anyone who is willing to repent and return to God can be assured of God's forgiveness. But I think that a careful reading of the story reveals that Jesus is teaching something even more radical than Luke. Divine love is totally unpredictable and all-pervasive. In this story no repentance is required to get back the father's graces. All that is required is a willingness to be found. "But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again, he was lost and has been found."

There is so much richness in this story about the love of parents for their children. First, parents should love their children enough to let them fail while always keeping out the welcome mat. That's kind of how God loves us. As a loving parent, the father took no delight in his son's pain or failure. And her never tried to persuade him to return, rather he let him hit bottom. But! The minute he saw him from afar he runs to meet him. What a sight! No "I told you so's." The son had suffered and decided to return on his own. He didn't expect anything. The father, however, wanted to show total forgiveness, even to the extent of a celebration. Wow! And this is what God does for us. We have all been the younger son at some time. We've known the pain of estrangement, feeling unworthy, yet desiring to come home. As a priest in the confessional, I am there to welcome you home and invite you back to

the banquet. Like you I must confess sin also. We don't have to be perfect to come home, just sorry for our sins, with a desire to love God more. The Church is not a hotel for saints. It's a hospital for sinners. Lent is a good time to come home.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a great way to make it happen!



God wants us all to be at his table. Once we know the joy of reconciliation with God through Christ, we are then charged with the responsibility of being his ambassadors. God wants us to go out and tell others that Christ has removed barriers between us and the loving Father, who eagerly awaits our homecoming. If there is anything in life that separates you from God, let yourself be found, reconciled, and freed to you can feel right at home again.


