

Merry Christmas to everyone! Once again, I feel so very blest to be here and to be able to wish everyone Merry Christmas in print and in person. 






Remembering Sather Bill...







Reverend Monsignor William Jablonski

1937–2018 ORDAINED A PRIEST ON JUNE 1, 1963 PASTOR OF ST. RAYMOND CHURCH 1995–2010







I had just gotten word the night before that my sister Esther died. The first thing I thought of was going to the charch to pray and just be with God. In walks Fr. Bill. He sees me crying, he comes over to me and consoled me. We were in the right place together. —Maureen Schwartz

I'll never forget when Fr. Bill came over to my house, it was May 2001, my husband Jack was on hospice care and I know he hadn't long to live. That Sunday he was outside greeting the parishioners after Mass as he often would do. I came out and told him about Jack, he said he would be over soon and he came and gave Jack the healing rites. We had a nice visit after that. At that point I don't think that Jack was aware of what was going on but it certainly put my mind at ease.

Fr. Bill was very encouraging with the Blood Drive. He would always come over every Sunday we had it in May and October. Many times he'd come over more than once not just to visit, but to take some of the packages of cookies, especially the Lorna Doones. They were his favorites. The donors were glad to see him as were Maura and I. —Mary Ann Hartt





Fr. Bill used to pass by our house regularly and admire our big blue spruce tree in the front yard. In October 2000, my husband George wound up in hospital. As it got closer to Christmas, Father would stop me and ask, "Who's going to decorate the tree this year?" Of course, he knew that one of our boys would come to the rescue. That job fell to our son Michael. I feel certain that he might have had a little encouragement from Fr. Bill to do this! Even after Fr. Bill left St. Raymond's he would drop us a note or stop us when we saw him and inquire about "that tree." Some years ago the tree fell down. We didn't have the heart to let him know!

My daughter and her family come from New Jersey every year to attend Midnight Mass with us. My granddaughter Lauren used to love it when Fr. Bill would walk down the aisle carrying the Baby Jesus up high for all to see and then place Him in the manger. This was such a special moment for everyone in the church. We really miss him! —Connie McDougal



I have so many good memories of Fr. Bill, he was so caring to everyone in my family. My father used to say he should have been made Bishop because he was so gifted, but I think he was happiest when he was with his parishioners in his beloved St. Raymond's. He was always quick with a joke and very thoughtful; he would casually show up in someone's hospital room unannounced and he never seemed to miss a parish function.

When I received a cancer diagnosis I approached him after Mass and asked him to pray for me; his response was, "Praise the Lord!" I was a little taken back, but quickly realized I was being prayed over by a man of true faith and his praising the Lord on my behalf was proof that he believed the Gospel message; that God will work all things for our good, we just need to trust Him. Father Bill was indeed a good shepherd. — Anonymous



Father Bill was always so kind to everyone. I remember going to Mercy Rehab for physical therapy, a friend of mine was going as was Fr. Bill and a friend of his from the parish. There were times Fr. Bill didn't want to do his exercises. We would coax him and tell him to do them with us and slowly he came around. We did a lot of laughing and encouraged each other and made it fun. It felt good to have others we knew from church and that we weren't doing our therapy all alone. We all looked forward to it. Quite often when Father Bill came to visit, he would ask me how my shoulder was. He never forgot.

I remember Fr. Bill being a "Yes Man."

Whether you itemize or not in 2018, this unique opportunity allows you to make a charitable contribution through a direct IRA transfer while <u>reducing your adjusted</u> gross income.

If you would like to make a gift to our Parish using your IRA and if:

- You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify)
- You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.


