


Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time! We come to the final days of this segment of Ordinary Time. The holy season of Lent will begin this coming Ash Wednesday, March 6th. Today's readings point out the harsh criticism that Jesus levels at hypocrites who judge others for the same faults found in their own lives. The first reading from Sirach cautions people to be discerning in judgement. Words can reveal what lies deep and unseen within the heart. "The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had; so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind." Then in 1 Corinthians, Paul again looks forward to the victory of life over death. "But thanks be to God who gives the victory through our Lord, Jesus *Christ.*" And finally, Luke's gospel collects sayings from Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. The main point is that one lives their covenant relationship with God the best when one imitates God. The blind cannot lead the blind. There is a hypocrisy in judging others and good people produce good things. To accomplish these admonishments, one tries best to follow Jesus. "No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher."

Because it is rooted in falsehood and deception, hypocrisy is a particularly subtle and sinister vice to which religious leaders may be especially susceptible. Ralph Waldo Emerson once noted, "People are very inclined to set moral standards for others." The implication is that we may not use the same criteria to regulate our own lives. Clergy of all faiths are in a precarious position here, for it is expected that they will publicly preach morality, since after all, it's their job so to speak. There is a Latin phrase that scarcely requires translation to show why abusive behavior by any clergy is particularly scandalous: "Corruptio optimi pessima est" which means: "The corruption of the best is worse of all." And we can see this most deploringly in the sexual abuse scandals that has and continues to stain the priesthood and Church hierarchy. Professing truth rings very hollow when truth is not lived.

In Luke's version of the condemnation of hypocrisy, Jesus directs the message not to the Pharisees but to his own disciples. And later in the same gospel, the same disciples are told to accept the

kingdom "like a child."
Fear of being labeled a
hypocrite should not lead
us to give up on any and
all public endorsements
of moral standards. The
only two alternatives to
hypocrisy are perfection
and honesty. I would say
forget the perfection and
work on the honesty. We
approach the Lord's
table, profoundly aware



of our need for both forgiveness and nourishment so that we might not only proclaim the Gospel but live it. We pray today that the Eucharist may bring us not judgment and condemnation but instead healing in mind and body.

This coming Wednesday, March 6th is Ash Wednesday which signals the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent for 2019. This bulletin contains a special Lenten page that outlines all the spiritual and practicable opportunities to help make our parish Lenten journey a truly awesome and spiritually enriching one. Please make note of all the prayer opportunities as well as our "Giving, Not Giving Up, It's a Lenten Thing" program for all the Sundays of Lent. Together, may we journey through the desert and to the cross that leads us all to the joy of Resurrection life.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, in fo from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, the schedule for Ash Wednesday, an invitation to the upcoming St. Patrick's Celebration on Saturday, March 23rd and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great first week of March and a peaceful entry into Lent! Start wearing that Lenten smile as you pray, fast and help others during this time. Plus, remember: One day you will rest in peace. So why not live in peace too? Happy Lent! God Bless always!





Lent 2010

Dear Friends:

As we begin our prayer, fasting and almsgiving for the needs of the poor and the suffering of the world in this Lenten season 2019, we recommit ourselves to repentance, conversion and holiness individually and as a Church. We remember in a focused way this Lent the survivors of clergy sexual abuse and all forms of abuse and we pray for the surification, reform and sanctification of the Church.

In Rejoice and Be Giga. Pope Francis says: "De not be afraid of holiness. If will take away none of your energy, vitality or iny (32)... The Lord wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence (1)... Holiness is the most attractive face of the Church (9)... The Church needs passionate missionaries, anthusiastic about sharing true life. The saints surprise us, they confound us because by their lives they arge as to ahandon a dull and dreary mediocrity (138)."

One of the ways we commit ourselves to this radiant, natural and humble holiness is by expanding the breadth and depth of our daily engagement with the inspired Sacred Scriptures. We are called to live the words of Psalm 119: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

The saints of every decade and century inspire us since "the most profound interpretation of Scripture comes precisely from those who let themselves be shaped by the word of God through listening, reading, and assiduous meditation". (Pope Benedict XVI. The Word of the Lord.) (48) Could each one of as individually and together, united in communion as a Church, take one step with the Holy Spirit this Lent to deepen our love for the inspired Sacred Scriptures?

In his Apostolic Exhortation *The Word of the Lord* (2010), Pope Benedict XVI gives us an excellent process of praying individual biblical passages, a process of *lectio divina* or sacred reading of the text that includes reading, meditating, praying, contemplating and living the biblical text. We need to believe with confidence and a spiral of adventure that the Holy Spirit is present in the text and that the Holy Spirit's longues of flame are connecting the text to our souls transforming us in mysterious and prefound ways.

I would like to analyze and comment on the steps that Pope Benedict XVI proposes to us. (For the complete version of Bishop Barres' Lenten Letter 2019 which analyzes Pope Benedict's approach to feath divina, see this link www.bishopborrestentletter2019.org.) The Word of God makes us realists who recognize that the Word of God is the foundation of all things. (10)

As your bishop and servant, I invite you during this Lenten Season 2019 and beyond, to discover or rediscover the power of the Word of Cool by reading, meditating, praying, contemplating and living the inspired Secret Scriptures. In the end, as Father Gaston Courtois points out: "Contemplatives are the true missionaries and alone can be the true spiritual teachers".

Thank you all for your passion and daily dedication to the inspired Sacred Scriptores. Thank you for being the contemplatives, the missioneries, the spiritual teachers that are the agents and instruments of dramatic missionary growth on Long Island and beyond.


The EAC Network is an in-home respite program, not for profit, social service agency that provides respite for caregivers of the elderly in Nassau County.

St. Raymond Memorials



Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having *Mass Intentions*, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the *Bread and Wine*, the *Rose for Life* and the *Sanctuary Lamp*. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.

There are also other liturgical items that are seasonal, like the *Christmas* and *Easter*Flowers, the *Paschal Candle*, *Advent Wreath*

Candles and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a "Memorial Brick" that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations. One location is by the Holy Family Statue on the front lawn of the rectory, the St. Teresa Statue behind the rectory, the God and Country Memorial near the front of the church and finally our newest Padre Pio Statue on the walkway between the rectory and church. Each location is open for anyone wishing to have such a Memorial Brick placed there.

These bricks are 4" by 8" with up to three lines of text. The donation for each brick is \$250. Anyone wishing to purchase one of these bricks should contact the rectory during regular office hours. Maybe you will consider one of these special places on the grounds of St. Raymond to celebrate life and pay tribute to someone dear to you.
