Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as "Gaudete Sunday!" The theme of "joy" should now guide all our preparations for Christmas. By immersing ourselves in the rituals of the season our faith can shine forth brightly. In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet contrasts the harsh land of the desert with the lushness of the gardens that God's salvation will bring. And this transformation will not only be of the earth but also for humanity. "Those whom the Lord has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will *flee.*" Then in the second reading James is urging his readers to be patient and ready, for the Lord will be coming again. "Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand." And finally, Matthew's gospel draws the tension and distinctions between Jesus and John the Baptist. John understand his mission is to "prepare the way of the Lord" yet he wonders if Jesus is the true Messiah. Jesus' answer is a description of his actions. He is hoping that John can link the description of the messianic age and Jesus' mission in fulfilling it. Jesus also wants to clarify the importance of John the Baptist. He is no mere celebrity prophet impressing the rich and famous. He is the real thing, a prophet proclaiming the word of God. "Amen, I say to you, among those born of women, there is none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

Advent is always about "ready" and "not yet."
We know that Jesus has been born into our world already, but we sense deep in our being that the reign of God is not yet shining with the glory and splendor that we long for in our lives. Over the years, our vision may have dimmed a bit, and we have trouble seeing what perhaps we saw more clearly as children; that with the birth of Christ into our world, with Christmas, things are meant to be different. We are called to see, to hear and to leap with joy at the coming of the Messiah, even as we are also called to proclaim good news to the poor and raise to new life those dead to the reality of what love can do for all of us when it is shared with others as God shares his life and love with us.

The reign of God was indeed at hand as John's followers returned to him with good news. John must have rejoiced that he had prepared the way for God's coming into his world. The question is: are we preparing the way for God to come into our world?"

Of all the holiday meals of the season, none is a simple as the one we share around the table of the Eucharist. In its very simplicity, this meal challenges us always to see with a clarity born of faith, which is the greatest gift and greatest reality of all. God has loved us so much that he came once to be one of us and he comes again and again to be with us every time we gather for Mass.

Today our parish celebrates *Gaudete Sunday* with a festive *Hospitality Sunday* sponsored by the Sodality of Our Lady. It begins in the school cafeteria immediately following the 9am Family Mass and continues till after the 12noon Mass. All Christmas Plant orders should be picked up at this time in the cafeteria. Also, the winner for our special Christmas Cash 50/50 will be pulled at the end of Hospitality today. You can still purchase chances right up to the drawing. So, come by for some refreshments and friendship; pick up your Christmas Plants and make sure you're in it for the Christmas Cash 50/50. *Then in the evening, our* Adult Choir will present its annual Lessons and Carols starting at 7:30pm in our church. Through scripture and song, the Christmas story is presented in a way that truly enhances our Advent spirituality. Come and bring a friend.

On Tuesday, December 17th, we will celebrate an *Advent Penance Service* (with Confessions) starting at 7:30pm in the church. It will be the "*No Questions Asked*" format that we have used in the past. Take advantage of this important way to spiritually prepare for the Christmas season. Again, come and bring a friend.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St.

Raymond School, the Schedule of Christmas and New Year's Day Masses plus the additional times for Confession, the envelopes for the Christmas Masses of Remembrance, an invitation to FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Third Week of Advent! *Smile*, share and remember: Each of us is an innkeeper who decides if there is room for Jesus. God bless always.

The Three MMMs



Missals - The Season of Advent signals the change of missals for the new liturgical year. Our book, entitled Breaking Bread which is one book containing the hymnal and readings for the entire year. In addition, all of the missals are enclosed in new and old blue hard covers. This new book in its binder makes an attractive and

effective worship aid. Now I appeal for your help in keeping them in good condition. Please do not separate the book from the binder or take them from the pews. It seems that as time goes by, we begin missing a number of them. We have just the right amount to fill our worship needs. Also, please do not give them to young children for coloring or pacifying purposes. The pages are delicate and easily torn. When finished always close the binder and place upright in the pew rack. With your help their durability and quality will be maintained for the entire liturgical season, plus a neat appearance maintained in the congregation areas of our church worship space.

Munchies- You would be surprised at the amount of food that is left in the pew book racks and on the floors of the church. Crumbs are everywhere, food and candy wrappings are strewn all over and gum is often left stuck to the wood of the pews. I know that munchies have become necessary to occupy young children at Mass and we certainly want the children at Mass. However, it would be most helpful if some alternative behavior control could be utilized, especially when there are many not so young children with snack food at Mass. I ask that if you must have munchies for your children, please help by cleaning up after them.

Messiness- Each weekend we try to have the church looking good for the Sunday Masses. There is a dedicated crew of workers and volunteers who spend time each week making sure that our church is clean and attractive to be a fitting place to celebrate Mass. Many people come to our church from Saturday morning through Sunday night. They come for one of our six regular Sunday Masses, Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and other services. As the weekend events accumulate so does the general messiness of both places. Bulletins are strewn about, the blue booklets are haphazardly left about, and all sorts of litter is found in the pews, on the floor and especially in the book racks. The ushers, sacristans, ministers and others, like me, try to keep on top of things as we move along, but still it gets messy. If everyone would just be attentive to the space, you use and what you see around you I am sure that we can eliminate a lot of the messiness.

I mention these *Three MMMs* as we start our new Church Year of Advent. Our church has been cared for so that we start everything in a good, clean and attractive order. *Let's all do our fair share to keep our church as a beautiful place of prayer*. A little more concern and care is all we need. Thanks for taking the time to read this notice and for your help in carrying out its message. *-Father Chuck*




- Monday: Grades 2 & 3 to morning mass; Baked ziti at lunch

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM SIX MONTH DEVELOPING BABY

Although your spiritually adopted baby is growing rapidly, your baby's organs are still developing. His or her skin is bright pink, covered with a heavy protective creamy ointment "vernix". His or her eyelids separate, eyelashes form and the eyes are partially opened. The baby's weight is about two pounds. Any baby born at this time has a very good chance of surviving. Today, medical advances in caring for extremely small newborn infants are extraordinary. About nine out of ten babies will now survive with intensive care services. As this spiritually adopted child is being formed by our loving God, please continue to be faithful in your prayers for him or her, so that his or her mother will choose life for her little one. As you know, because of the law, the fathers are legally prohibited from protecting their baby from being killed through abortion. The woman's "right" supersedes, not only the baby's right to life, but the father's right to protect his child. Remember, the taking of the innocent baby's life in the womb through abortion is legal in America, up to and including the moment of birth. Recently, some elected officials even have stated that if a baby does survive the abortion, that is the baby has been born alive, then it is up to the mother and the doctor (the abortionist) to decide what should be done with the baby. In fact, our own Congresswoman, Kathleen Rice, recently wrote one of our members, "Legislation like the "Born-Alive Protection Act (HR. 962)" harm a woman's right to choose and criminalizes doctors, nurses, and other health care practitioners for personal medical decisions. I do not support H.R. 962, and would not vote for it or any other bill that places unnecessary restrictions on women and their doctors." The H.R. 962 would make it mandatory for the doctor to give to the infant that survived an abortion the same medical care that any baby just born would receive. What Cong. Rice fails to address is "the harm" that would be perpetrated on the live baby who survives the abortion, if the mother and the abortionist decide to complete what the abortion was to originally accomplish, the termination (death) of the baby. And what method would the doctor (the abortionist) use to cause the death of the baby?
