

### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings, God's blessings and Happy Advent to everyone! That's right! Today is the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year for the Church. Advent is a season of hope for the good things God has prepared for us. We just need to be prepared to receive them; whether Jesus comes on the last day of the world, the last day of our lives, the coming feast of Christmas, or in the opportunities of today. In the first reading from the Prophet Isaiah, we have mountain imagery where God's way will be clear for all to see once all obstacles have been removed. Once God's standards are in place, nations will experience a world changed for the better. "O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the **Lord.**" Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul warns that the Lord's arrival is close at hand and it is time for people to change their behavior from darkness to light. "For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed, the night is advanced, the day is at hand." And finally, Matthew's gospel, which will become the Sunday gospel for this new year, sets the theme for the entire Advent season. It is watchfulness. Only the Father knows when the Parousia is going to happen. Precisely because we don't know the exact time, everyone should live in a constant state of vigilance; but not in fear. "So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

What are we to prepare for? Isaiah speaks of a utopian age when all will receive just judgment. The fulfillment of this dream is the coming of Jesus Christ to the world. He offers us a kingdom, not of this world, where justice and peace can be realized. *How do we prepare?* Paul tells us to throw off the darkness of sin and take on acts of kindness and generosity to make God's love real in the world. Advent gives us a good time to draw on our prayer life, participate actively at Mass, make a good confession and take civic action to influence our elected officials regarding the many moral challenges facing our country.

We are all too familiar with the disasters that come upon us suddenly: floods, tornadoes, earthquakes, firestorms and so on. We realize the need to prepare for these occurrences. All the more so we should have a sense of urgent preparedness about the coming of Jesus. Our individual lives may well end before the world ends. To be ready we should practice being ready to meet him as he comes daily into our lives.

Advent offers us an opportunity to sharpen our vision and alert our sensitivity, to be prepared for the many ways Jesus comes to us each day. In a sense every Eucharist is an Advent. Jesus speaks to us in the word and nourishes us in the sacrament. Every Eucharist is an opportunity to meet Jesus. So, let's be prepared.

This Sunday, December 1st, we are beginning our *Forty Hours Devotion* at 5:30pm following the regular 4:30pm Mass. From then until 9:30am Tuesday morning, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the main altar of our church. It is an opportunity for each of us to enter Advent with minds and hearts open to our Lord, Jesus Christ. Hopefully it will be a grace-filled time for us individually and as the whole family of St. Raymond Parish. Check the full-page ad in this bulletin. It gives a schedule that we will follow for the forty hours. So make plans to spend some time with the Lord during these forty hours. I promise you it will be time well spent.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, especially regarding our Sponsor a Family and Giving Tree programs for Christmas, info from Religious Education, an invitation to our children's Christmas Pageant on Sunday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, order forms for the Christmas Cash 50/50 and the Christmas Plants, an invitation to sign-up for free to FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand), an order form for our special One Year Memorial Candles and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great start to the Advent season. Smile, share and be prepared to welcome the Christ child into your hearts once again at Christmas. Plus, come and spend some time with Jesus during our Forty Hours Devotion. And remember: You're not too bad to come in and you're not too good to stay out. God bless always.

# FORTY HOURS DEVOTION



Our parish's Forty Hours Devotion will begins TODAY, December 1<sup>st</sup> which is the First Sunday of Advent. It will commence at 5:30pm immediately following the regular 4:30pm Mass. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will continue on the main altar for the next 40 hours until 9:30am on Tuesday morning, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. At that time a Mass of Exposition will be celebrated. The regular 8:45am Mass on Tuesday will be moved to this time. During the forty hours, the church will remain opened with lighting in the first half of the church maintained throughout. The only interruptions to the Exposition will be for the 7:15am Masses on Monday and Tuesday, the 8:45am Mass on Monday and perhaps if there are any Funeral Masses on Monday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>. Otherwise the Exposition will be continuous throughout the forty hours.

The schedule for the Forty Hours Devotion will be as follows:

Sunday December 1<sup>st</sup>: After the initial Exposition at 5:30pm on Sunday, December 1<sup>st</sup>, there will be Confessions heard from 6-7pm. The Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary will be prayed at 8pm and Night Prayer at 10pm.

Monday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>: 7:15am and 8:45 Masses as usual. Confessions from 11am till 12noon, the Joyful Mysteries prayed at 1pm, the Divine Mercy Chaplet prayed at 3pm, Confessions from 4-5pm and 7-8pm, the Sorrowful Mysteries prayed at 8pm and Night Prayer at 10pm.

Tuesday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>: 7:15am Mass, the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary prayed at 8am and the Mass of Reposition celebrated at 9:30am to conclude our Forty Hours Devotion.

I believe that we can all benefit from having this concentrated time of Eucharistic Adoration. It can be a wonderful opportunity for the spiritual growth of each person as well as our whole parish. And what better time than the beginning of a new Church year and the start of Advent! We are asked to prepare our hearts to once again welcome the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. By spending some time in his holy presence during these forty hours, the seeds of a welcoming heart can be planted so that Advent will be a spiritually enriching time for all of us. And our beloved St. Raymond Parish will also benefit from this time of Eucharistic Adoration.

It is important that there always be some of us in the church during these forty hours. I have asked some of our parish organizations to commit to some of the hours scheduled. The time overnight both Sunday and Monday might be the hardest to cover. Probably from 10pm till 7am both Sunday and Monday nights. If you can commit to a certain hour(s), especially during these overnight times, please call the rectory so we can create a master coverage sheet. But above all, please just come to be with Jesus when you can!

May we all enter the spirit of this *Forty Hours Devotion* with prayerful reflection about our personal faith, our parish's mission moving forward, the need for healing for our whole Church and a deep desire to know, love and serve our Lord, Jesus as he leads us.



### Attention 7th grade Religious Education & St. Raymond School parents

The 7th grade Religious Education & St. Raymond School students (Kellenberg invited to participate but not mandatory) will be participating in their Confirmation service project on Monday 12/2/19 and Tuesday 12/3/19 from 7pm-8pm in the St. Raymond School auditorium The students are to come directly to the auditorium where attendance will be taken.

Each student is asked to bring one men's collared shirt (knit or woven fabric is acceptable - as long as it has a collar) for the residents of St. Christopher's Inn. Shirts can be purchased at stores such as Modells or Kohls at a bargain price. St. Christopher's Inn is a substance abuse rehabilitation center for men who suffer from alcohol or drug additions. When the men attend their mandatory weekly group sessions, they are required to wear a collared shirt (t-shirts are not allowed). There will be a guest speaker from St. Christopher's Inn who will speak to the students about the Inn.

The student is asked before they bring their shirt to class, to write an anonymous note of encouragement and attach it to the shirt packaging. There is a reflection paper in the student's Confirmation guidebook that will need to be completed after they attend this session.

St. Raymond School students can attend either night.

Please plan on attending the Christmas Pageant presented by the children of our parish on Sunday, December 8th, 2019 at 7pm in the St. Raymond Church.
