



Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! We also celebrate Independence Day this Sunday which is a day to remember how our country came to be and on what principles it was founded. Chief among them is that we are all created equal, and all have the right to pursue life, liberty and happiness. Just as we are compelled to reflect on the Word of God in the scriptures to see how well we are living by his word, today is a good day to reflect on how well as a country we are living up to our founding principles. Today's readings are a good reminder of this kind of reflection, for they recall that no matter where we are or who we are, we are all called to remain true to our identity as daughters and sons of God. In the first reading from the prophet, Ezekiel, God wants the prophet to continue preaching his word even though the people mostly refuse to listen. **"Hard of heart and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the Lord God!"** Then in the second reading from 2 Corinthians, Paul humbly accepts suffering ultimately knowing that it is for his spiritual benefit. **"Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong."** And finally, in today's gospel from Mark, we see Jesus coming home after doing much preaching and healing in the area of Galilee. However, in Nazareth, those who know him have a hard time believing in his power and stature. Their faith was not strong, and Jesus could accomplish very little among them, save for curing a few sick people. **"He was amazed at their lack of faith."**

In the first reading and in the gospel, we have people refusing to hear God's message or be open to Jesus. When have we refused to welcome God's word in our lives? When have we ignored Jesus in our midst? As baptized believers we are all called not only to follow Jesus in our lives but also to be a bold witness to his word by the example we set. Jesus was misjudged in his hometown of Nazareth. While his disciples recognized him as master and teacher, Nazareth just saw him as a **"hometown boy."** What about when we misjudge someone because of their skin color, educational background, religion, appearance, or manner of speaking?

What blessings are we missing because of misjudgment? Our birth puts us all on equal footing as children of God. Our baptism puts us all on equal footing to live as brothers and sister in Jesus. Our identity has nothing to do with age, race, social status, education, or financial success. Every one of us is made in the image and likeness of God. Our task is to cherish each child of God and to welcome each other's gifts as being important for the building up of the Body of Christ.

God's word today challenges us all to stop being stubborn and divisive and to open our lives to the power of Jesus' word proclaimed in our midst. It is a word that we must share with all people. This word always challenges us to refrain from judging others according to **"external trappings"** that are attractive and attention-getting by the world's standards. Remain faithful to God's call, preach his word of love, faithfulness, and truth everywhere we go, even to the rebellious and hard-hearted people. It is his word that has the power to save, bless, strengthen and heal in Jesus' name. May the Eucharist we share strengthen us to proclaim God's word and be instruments of Jesus' healing presence in the world.





Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by his disciples. When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands! Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

When the 1973 Supreme Court Decisions were made, abortion was sold as compassionate to those women who became pregnant because of rape or incest and that it would be "rare, safe and legal". We know now after 48 years of legalized abortion, the door to justifying the killing of the preborn babies has now extended to the point that in some states, New York State included, live babies in the womb can be legally killed right up to the moment of birth. And that time line may change to extend to include babies that have actually been born. Think that's going to far? Consider the following: "If a child were not declared alive until 3 days after birth, then all parents could be allowed a choice that only a few are given under the present system. The doctor could allow the child to die if the parents so chose and save a lot of misery and suffering." (Dr. James Watson, Nobel Prize winner, Time Magazine, 1973) "...my colleague Helga Kuhse and I suggested that a period of 28 days after birth might be allowed before an infant is accepted as having the same right to life as others." (Peter Singer, Professor of Bio-Ethics, Princeton University) "No newborn infant should be declared human until it has passed certain tests regarding its genetic endowment and if it fails these tests, it forfeits its right to life." Dr. Francis Crick, Nobel Prize winner, Pacific News Service, January, 1978) "It is reasonable to describe infanticide as post-natal abortion...Infanticide is actually a very humane thing when you are dealing with misbegotten infants. We might have to encourage it under certain conditionalities of excess population especially with defective children." (Joseph Fletcher, Harvard Divinity School, Infanticide and the Value of Life, 1978) As you can see, these comments above are from people with "credentials". There are many more people, more than one likes to think, who are in agreement with the above thinking. Even today, there is talk of "fourth-term" abortions, meaning "choice" of the life or death of babies after they are born. Please prayer and actively become involved in being a voice for these little ones.

Slavery: "A slave is the property of the owner & can be bought, sold used or even killed by the owner at the owner's discretion."

Abortion: An unborn baby is the property of the mother & she can have the baby killed by abortion, up to and including any time until baby's birth.

Slavery: Although he may have a heart, and a brain, and he may be a human life biologically, a slave is not a human person (Dred Scott Decision, 1857)

Abortion: Although he may have a heart and a brain and he may be a human life biologically, an unborn baby is not a legal person (Roe V. Wade, 1973)

Slavery: A black person only becomes a legal person when he or she is set free. Before that time we should not concern ourselves about him because he has no legal rights.

Abortion: A baby only becomes a legal person when he is born and in some cases now even if the baby is lucky to be born after the abortion (live-birth), even then the baby's life is still in jeopardy in some states.

Slavery: If you think slavery is wrong, nobody is forcing you to own slaves. But don't impose your morality on someone else!


Abortion: If you think abortion is wrong, nobody is forcing you to have one. But don't impose your morality on someone else!

Slavery: 11 years later in 1868, the 14th Amendment was enacted to right this dreadful wrong!

Abortion: Over 4 decades (45 years) have passed since the Supreme Court made its infamous and deadly abortion decision.

We have repeated history. Same old arguments, same old rationales, Just a different segment of our human family. How much longer is it going to take us to recognize and return protection to the vulnerable, innocent, voiceless little ones? To overturn the injustice to the babies in the womb?






SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL




The Message of Fatima






