# Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings are meant to refresh and reinforce the concept that everyone is being being called to discipleship. In the first reading from 1 Samuel, we see how as a young boy, Samuel was being called by God. His response is the model for all of us to follow when being called by the Lord. "Samuel answered, Speak, for your servant is listening." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul speaks of the body as a temple of the Holy Spirit, which will be raised to glory with Jesus. "Do you not know that that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own?" And finally, John's gospel passage shows how disciples of John the Baptist now go and follow Jesus. They are curious and when questioned by Jesus about what they are seeking, he tells them, "Come and you will see."

Is Jesus asking you the same question: "What are **you looking for?**" And how do you answer? Truth? Peace? Love? Help? Joy? Now consider that Jesus narrows the focus: "What are you looking for from me." Now how would you answer? I believe that these questions apply equally to a seasoned follower as to a curious seeker, only in different ways. If we stop looking for something, there's a good chance that we will become stagnant. When it comes to discipleship, each call is different, and they are all alike. Their common elements are being called by Jesus, learning from him, and sharing faith in him with others. The differences arise from the unique gifts and unique circumstances of each disciple. We easily forget that each of us has a calling as real as that of Pope Francis. Some calls require prominence, others do not. All are real and each is important. We can learn from all the characters in today's readings. Eli shows us that even if we are stale in our discipleship, we can still be effective in steering someone to Jesus. Samuel has the perseverance of youth. John the Baptist doesn't' try to hold his disciples back when Jesus comes along. And Andrew shows acceptance when Peter is chosen to be the leader even though Andrew had been with Jesus first. So, no matter who we are, when we are called and for what, may we always have the light to discern how that call affects our ever -changing lives.

Well as I write this column for this Sunday's bulletin, a lot of things have happened. Just when you didn't think things could get any worse in our country, the events of January 6<sup>th</sup> in Washington, D.C. proved otherwise. There is no way on earth that there could be a condoning of what took place in the storming of the Capitol. Lawlessness, violence, and death all played a part. Now what do we do? No matter what political side you are on, there can be zero tolerance for the hatred that has permeated the political discourse these past months. As Catholics, we foster peace and respect for the sanctity of each life, whether we agree or not. As Catholics and Americans, let us follow God's ways and act only as instruments of his peace and love.

On a personal note, as you heard last Sunday, I have tested positive for COVID-19. I thought that I had been doing a pretty good job of social distancing, during these past 10 months. But it caught me. Now so far, my symptoms are flu-like, muscle aches and tiredness. Hopefully, it won't progress any further. This just goes to show how this terrible scourge has a huge grip on our nation and we need to step up our vigilance and respect for the safety of each other. I am almost finished with my quarantine so if all goes well, you will see me again soon. Thanks for your prayers and cards. They mean a lot.

But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. Help them to see that the child they carry is made in Your image, as well as theirs, made for eternal life.


