### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's final Easter blessings be yours on the great Feast of Pentecost! Today we celebrate the Birthday of the Church when the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles and imbued them with the spiritual gifts needed to go forth and proclaim the "good news" of the Risen Lord Jesus. To mark this special feast, we are celebrating a Parish Ministry Fair after all the Masses for Pentecost right on our front lawn next to the church. The fair is meant to showcase the many ministries we foster here, and how St. Raymond Parish has continued to build up the Kingdom of God for the past 110 years by responding to the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our time and place.

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles depicts the Pentecost experience of the Holy Spirit coming upon the apostles in the upper room. "Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them." Then in 1 Corinthians, Paul speaks of the gifts of the Spirit and how we are one body with many parts. "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or freepersons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." And finally, in the Gospel of John, once again we are treated to the words of Jesus as he assures his disciples that the Holy Spirit will come upon them to strengthen and teach them in the ways of Jesus. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always."

The gift of the Holy Spirit assures us that, as with the disciples, the Lord is always at our side. We are warmed by the Spirit's presence and invited to rejoice that God never leaves us frightened and alone. To have faith in Jesus is a gift of the Spirit. The Spirit enlightens us and brings to light what is otherwise hidden. On the first Pentecost, the Spirit gave foreigners the gift of understanding one another, despite speaking different languages. When we hear the words of Scripture proclaimed at Mass, we do so with confidence in the Spirit's presence. It is by the Holy Spirit that we may truly hear God's voice. Likewise, when we offer bread and wine, it is by the Spirit that they are made into Christ's Body and Blood. *In all we do the Holy* Spirit is with us!

Just as the Holy Spirit helps us to hear the word of God and bring us his Body and Blood; the Spirit descends on us as a community of believers, truly making us members of the one Body of Christ.

In the "spirit" of Pentecost we are celebrating a special *Parish Ministry Fair* after all the Masses this weekend on the front lawn by the church. The Fair is our way of showcasing all the ministries that make up St. Raymond Parish. Each ministry has a display table to advertise and hopefully recruit more members so that we can continue the good works of our parish.
