Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of this Sunday's readings is to see the importance of humility in one's faith responses. In the first reading from Sirach, we see the teacher encouraging his readers to foster a spirit of humility. Humble service to others will lead to a greater expression of gratitude. ***"Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God."*** Then in the second reading from Hebrews, it is the power of the Risen Lord that draws the community of faith together. Jesus is the mediator of the new covenant. His blood was shed for our salvation and has thus accomplished what Abel's blood could not. Then in Luke's gospel, we have Jesus offering a corrective instruction. Observing the way guests jockey for positions of honor at a banquet, Jesus promotes a reversal of order. ***"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled and everyone who humbles himself will be exalted."***

Humble acts cannot be done to achieve any purpose other than to please God, who exhibited the greatest act of humility in becoming human. Humility can be a very elusive gift. Just when we think we have the virtue, we've lost it because of being proud of being humble. What a bind! Who can really be humble? The virtue begins with a decision to be humble before it is ever put into action. It is a virtue that allows us to use our gifts without being prideful. It is put into action without expectations. ***Jesus is the perfect example of humility.*** He had nothing to gain for himself by becoming human. Though God, he embraced humility with all the limits of time and space, suffering and pain, hunger and rejection. The selfless reward was that Jesus secured salvation for all who accept it.

The desire to be humble should precede any humble act. Jesus washed the feet of the apostles to show the importance of humble service. This action came out of who he was. Pretending to be humble for personal gain is hypocritical. Sirach and Jesus were not encouraging this. They were merely giving examples of the behavior of a genuinely humble person. God calls us to be the best version of ourselves. We can't do it if fear or pride holds us back from using our gifts. Humility is acknowledging our gifts and knowing who to thank.

St. John Paul II demonstrated great humility when he let the effects of his Parkinson's disease be visible to the world. He made himself vulnerable by not hiding his illness. I'm sure we can all think of people we know who also demonstrate genuine humility. And how humble Jesus comes to us under the guise of unleavened bread and table wine. We humbly receive this gift of Jesus today, realizing that we can never earn it or be worthy of it.

At this time, I am happy to welcome our new Associate Pastor to St. Raymond Parish. ***Father Theodore Iloh*** who is starting his new assignment with us this weekend. Father Ted is from the Diocese of Awka in Nigeria. He just recently celebrated his 25th Anniversary of Ordination. On behalf of all the people of St. Raymond Parish I welcome you, Father Ted, to St. Raymond's. I trust that your assignment here will be a fruitful and satisfying one. We all look forward to getting to know you and enjoying your priestly ministry. Look for Father Ted at a Mass near you.

And as we say hello to Father Ted, we also sadly say goodbye to ***Fathers Pio and Michael*** who will be returning to the Solomon Islands this week. Both have finished their studies here and now will be returning home to continue their priestly ministry among the people of the Solomon Islands. It has been a joy to have these two priests with us for parts of the past three years. We wish you all the best and will pray for your success and well-being. And don't forget, you always have a home away from home at St. Raymond's.

The message of Fatima consists of a number of precise predictions, requests, warnings and promises concerning the faith and the world, which were conveyed by the Blessed Virgin Mary to three shepherd children: Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco in a series of apparitions at Fatima, Portugal from May through October 1917.

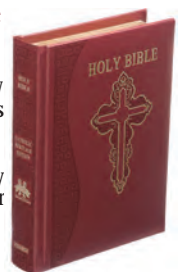
