

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time! Repentance, prayer and the call to discipleship are the themes of this Sunday's readings. In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet looks forward to the day when the people of Israel listen to God. Usually, it takes much suffering for them to get back on track. Here Isaiah speaks of the light of faith that brings joy to the people of Israel. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul urges the faithful to strive for unity in word and deed. "I urge you brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose." And finally, Matthew's gospel depicts the beginning of Jesus' ministry in Galilee. He has withstood the temptation in the desert and now he begins the fulfillment of the prophecy. He radicalizes the message of John the Baptist, calling people to repentance for the kingdom of God is at hand. There is more urgency now because Jesus is present. And he calls disciples to assist him. "He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people."

We know that Jesus left Nazareth. He moves from living according to the law of Moses to living in relationship with the Father. In Jesus' baptism and in the declaration that he is the "Beloved Son of the Father," we see a new emphasis in our relationship with God. The gospel section dealing with the call of these four fishermen emphasizes the dramatic nature of God's call. They didn't simply leave what they were doing out of boredom or discontent. Their calling was a moment of epiphany. They sensed that they were being called to something very good. The charism of Jesus draws them, and they perceive that what he is asking is a new and better way. They sense an authority that comes from God. These fishermen and the others who were called followed the inner voice of the shepherd. They followed the mysterious alternative of listening to their hearts, which seemed to defy all logic. We too, can line up the pros and cons to discover where our heart and mind lie. However, our relationship with Jesus comes from deep within, where he waits for us.

Can you take the leap to enter the heart of God, who lives within you? As we come to the table of the Lord today, may we see ourselves as those fishermen at the shore. And may we meet Christ who invites us to abandon all for him.

Today starts our annual celebration of Catholic Schools Week. Our parish is very proud of St. Raymond Catholic Grammar School which has been serving our community for over 90 years. The 9am Mass today will officially start our celebration followed by breakfast in the school cafeteria, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. Then beginning at 10:30am the school will hold an *Open House* for all interested parishioners. We hope to especially attract prospective new families who may consider St. Raymond Grammar School as the choice for your child's education. So please, stop by your school for some breakfast, and to see what we have to offer for your children-namely a great education in a faith-filled and nurturing environment. And spread the word! Check the bulletin ad for information about the whole celebration of Catholic Schools Week right here!
