## Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Third Sunday of Lent! This third week starts with encouragement to do a thorough Lenten renewal. The first reading today gives us the Ten Commandments to review as a good place to start one's personal reflection. The first commandment is the basis for all the behavior that the other commandments extol. It is the one which sets us on a course of life and faith that keep one close to God. "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul uses one sentence to put down the demand for signs and earthly wisdom. Rather, it is Christ crucified that is proclaimed which shows the power and wisdom of God. And finally, in John's gospel we see the familiar episode showing the anger of Jesus as he condemns the whole Temple system. The Temple was to be a place where God's presence was available to all who sought it. It should embrace all aspects of peace and justice manifested through prayer and sacrifice. But it had done none of this according to the accusation of Jesus. Then Jesus speaks of his body as now the Temple which will withstand even death itself. "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."

As we get closer to springtime there is a push to turn one's household upside down in the annual ritual of spring cleaning. Lent is a time for our spiritual spring housecleaning. Jesus went to the central place of his people's faith, the temple in Jerusalem to make an impression. He saw deeply what needed reforming. he demanded a complete change of heart for God's people. Jesus' risen body would be the new temple. The foolishness of the cross would be vindicated by the resurrection on the third day. All those who believed in him would be in fact his Body, the Church called to imitate the pattern of his death, and thus sharing in his resurrection. So, we are now called every Lent to go again to the center of our faith, our share in Jesus' death and resurrection. We are asked to examine how our conviction and practice may have gathered dust during this past year. Especially with the pandemic ruling over our lives, we need to rise above its grasp and shine with the light of Jesus Christ. It's only human for us to get complacent and depressed, to slack off, to compromise with evil and get comfortable with our sins

So, yes, we really have to get it all outside for an airing. The virus of sin can infect all of us. And there is wickedness and division in our own Church, our country and even in our own families. It can be scary to face the personal and societal reforming we need, requiring a change of heart, not some superficial window dressing. But more than a routine ritual is needed. We need the bravery and grace to look deeper and to cleanse more thoroughly. We need to take responsibility for what is going on in our world. Lent needs to be taken very seriously. May we get the message right this year, this Lent. May we be fools for the sake of Jesus and know the renewal and life that only such foolishness can bring.

Last year due to the upheaval caused by COVID-19, I did not engage our parish in the **2020 Catholic Ministries Appeal.** I know that in general the appeal suffered a financial loss as did many parishes due to the pandemic. However, the diocese tried to continue its mission of service through its many ministries. As a parish we did very poorly and I expected as much since I made no mention of the appeal at all during the year. Now we are into the **2021 CMA** and hopefully we will do better. I ask everyone to read the weekly flyers in the bulletin as well as the mailings that come directly to you from the appeal office. And if you have the means and are inclined, perhaps donate or pledge to this year's appeal. Remember that all donations are credited to our parish for the possibility of a rebate depending on how successful we are by the end of the year.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks, an ad for Gift Card Sunday which is next Sunday, March 14, a special Litany to St. Joseph to pray during his month, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Third Week of Lent. Smile, share, pray to St. Joseph and remember: Life is uncertain. God is not. God bless always.

#### **GOSPEL**

He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

## THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS STATIONS 1-7



#### THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

#### THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





#### THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. Help me, Jesus, to really understand all that You have done for me. Help me to make my burden lighter.

#### THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

How does anyone have the strength to watch someone they love suffer and die? Death knows no boundaries and takes everyone. I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





#### THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Please help me to be nicer to those who are against me, and let me be trusting in my relationships with my friends, family and neighbors. I have enough to handle on my own. Why, then, am I further burdened with worry about family members or friends? Why does it always seem to be me who has to take on their problems as well as my own? Lord, show me the way.

#### THE SIXTH STATION-VERONICA WIPES THE FACE OF JESUS

Every day I see people who are suffering or in need of help. They seem to be everywhere. I wish someone would help them. I'm so busy; I just don's have the time. That isn't really true. I guess I just don't want to be involved. I have my own problems, I don't need to take on any more. O Lord, teach me to see Your face in the faces of those who need comfort. You have assured us that random acts of kindness will have their own rewards, if not here and now, then later, with you in the kingdom.





#### THE SEVENTH STATION-JESUS FALLS AGAIN

In spite of my best intentions, I am so weak and fall again. I try to do the right thing, but temptations are so strong. I know, when Jesus stumbles and falls, He is suffering greatly. He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. With Your help, I can have the courage and the faith to get up again and continue on. Help me to pray that I will not follow my own way but, instead, the way of the Lord, for which Jesus was sacrificed.

#### THE EIGHTH STATION-JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



#### THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

#### THE TENTH STATION-JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS

My possessions are very important to me. I surround myself with beautiful and expensive things. I have far more clothes than I really need, and sometimes I spend money on silly things and forget about others who don't even have necessities. Dear Jesus, you not only sacrificed everything, You laid down Your life for me. Help me to be a strong spiritual follower in faith. Please show me the right way towards eternal happiness by following Your example.





#### THE ELEVENTH STATION-JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS

O, my God, sometimes I persecute others because they are different. I am embarrassed when I think of some of the things I've said about others. It's so easy to gossip. Sometimes I just don't like people because of their skin color or religion. Give me the courage to not give in to the pressures of putting others down. Dear Jesus, please forgive me and the others like me, and help me, instead to be Your messenger of love and care to all I meet so that they may experience Your love and concern through me.

#### THE TWELFTH STATION-JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS

Jesus, give me the strength so that I can survive the mysteries of life that are ahead of me. I know I'm going to fall many times. Give me the courage to stand back up. Let me recognize all the good things that surround me each day of my life. Our heavenly Father gave all of us a beautiful world. You even died so our sins would be forgiven. May I be like You in Your perfect example of sacrifice and love. Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.





#### THE THIRTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS

Lord I am truly sorry for forgetting You. I am sometimes preoccupied by my life when I should be focusing on You. I really don't know why, but I always seem to let all the things in my life crowd you out. Often, when I do pray, I do not concentrate on my prayer. ## Principal's Corner Sister Ruthanne

Today is the Third Sunday of Lent which is about the midpoint of the season of Lent. It seems as if this Lent is moving even faster than usual and I am wondering if we (I) are using all the opportunities that the Lord is providing for us during this time. In the first reading from Exodus, we hear the account of the Ten Commandments reminding us what we should be doing in our lives. Are we following those as we should? Do we need to be reminded that they are the "commandments" not "suggestions"? We know that we have a merciful and kind God who will treat us accordingly. However, we need to do our part as well. Let us say with the psalmist, "Lord, you have the words of everlasting life."

During this second week of March, some of our students are still in the process of completing the second set of i-Ready diagnostic tests in Math and Reading. Hopefully, we will see progress from the first round of testing. The students continue to practice using the i-Ready site on a weekly basis.

All parish  $8^{th}$  graders who have been accepted into a Catholic High School have the opportunity to participate in the Sodality's Scholarship Test this coming Thursday afternoon from 4 to 5 PM. 

## Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain **entirely** from meat/ poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on **Ash Wednesday** and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** fast and abstinence.






