Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)! And today after three months we are able to celebrate Mass with our parishioners in St. Raymond Church. Praise the Lord! We received word last Saturday that as of Wednesday, June 10th, churches may be opened for public Masses once again. However, there are certain restrictions that have been handed on to us from the diocese.

- 1. You can only use 25% of your church's regular seating capacity for Mass. Pews have to be taped closed and distance seating must be observed. For St. Raymond Church, 25% is about 125 people.
- 2. Everyone must wear a mask or facial covering.
- 3. All missalettes must be removed from the church.
- 4. There will be regular cleaning between Masses.
- 5. Until further notice, Holy Communion will not be distributed. This is a tough one I know, and we are waiting for the explicit guidelines and regulations on when and how we can start distributing Holy Communion. Maybe by the time you read this we will have those guidelines, but chances are it will be a little bit longer. Our physical presence to the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is still a spiritual benefit even without receiving Holy Communion.
- 6. We will have our regular schedule of Masses both Weekday and Sunday to start this re-opening and see how it goes. If we need to make changes we will adjust accordingly. The Parish Website will always contain the most up to date information.

So that is where we are at as of right now. It will be a challenge to make these changes. I hope we can feel a hopeful encouragement by this step forward. *What is needed by all of us is a spirit of cooperation, understanding and patience.* May we all pledge ourselves in that spirit and thank God for what is and what is to come.

This weekend we are celebrating the 2020 Graduation of the Eighth Grade Class from St. Raymond School.

While we were not able to celebrate in the usual manner, we still gathered the graduates and their families for an outdoor, socially distanced graduation on Saturday morning. We are very proud of this class and know that while they have had to face the disappointments that have come to everyone during this pandemic, they have still accomplished much and we know that their futures will be bright, happy and fruitful. May God bless them and their families now and always.

Next Sunday is Father's Day and that is when we will have the drawing for the "Go for the Green 50/50" that was extended past the original date. The pot is just about \$5000 and still growing. Chances are available at the rectory during the hours of 9am-3pm. They are \$10 each and 3 for \$25. Maybe get some for your Dad for Father's Day!

Remember that Parish Social Ministry is now open from Monday through Thursday, 10am till 2pm. It is important that clients make an appointment for assistance by calling (887-9197). Food donations are also being accepted. Check the ad in the bulletin for more details on what is needed.

Today's Feast of Corpus Christi is supposed to be a feast that unites us with God and one another. While we may not be able to receive the Body and Blood of Christ as yet, we should remember the words of Jesus at the Last Supper: "Do this memory of me." He also gave the example of "foot washing" to show the importance of serving one another. Everything about the Eucharist is meant to be a sign and an instrument of unity. Our yearning to receive the Body and Blood of Christ once again should also be a yearning to be one in love with God and one another. When we once again say "Amen" upon receiving the Eucharist we will be affirming not only the Real Presence of Jesus but also, we will be agreeing to be the Body of Christ and to flesh out that Real Presence for others. May we be ready for that when we again share the fullness of the Table of the Lord. God bless always.

St. Raymond Memorials

Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having *Mass Intentions*, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the **Bread and Wine**, the Rose for Life and the Sanctuary Lamp. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.

There are also other liturgical items that are seasonal, like the Christmas and Easter Flowers, the Paschal Candle, Advent Wreath Candles and other holy items we can use for religious services.
