#### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! On this midsummer Sunday, we are shown through God's word and the Eucharist that the mission of Jesus was not his alone to accomplish. In the first reading from the Prophet, Amos, we see how far the people have strayed from God and even the preaching of truth by Amos will not let the people be spared God's judgment. Yet still he tries to do what God has told him. "The Lord took me from following the flock and said to me. 'God, prophesy to my people Israel.'" Then in the second reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, he exults in how the people who believe have been blessed by God and they are sealed with the Holy Spirit to guide them along the path that leads to eternal life. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him." And finally, Mark's gospel shows how Jesus gives his disciples a quick course in how to prepare for and carry out their ministry. When they followed Jesus' instructions the following happened. "The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them."

Often, we hear about visions that others have experienced. How about you? Have you ever had a vision? One vision all Christians should have is a call to carry on the ministry of Jesus. That is the call or vision the Holy Spirit conferred upon us when we were baptized and confirmed. Sometimes, like the Israelites in the days of Amos, we can be drawn to convenience over commitment. The people then were drawn to the convenience of the local temple and distracted from the proper one in Jerusalem. Even though we are currently dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass, will the arrangement of this past year and a half lead us astray when the obligation is restored on August 15<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of the Assumption; or will that be a time bringing us to a closer presence? Our global pandemic has brought many challenges. Hopefully, our faith has also increased.

We believe that God is always with us, through thick and thin. No matter our path in life, we are called to continue in the way of Jesus. No matter whether single or married, no matter our occupation or station in life, the invitation is open to us. You and I are extensions of Jesus' ministry. Hearing the Gospel each Sunday is not enough. Active participation at Mass is good but also not enough. We are invited each week to carry the message with us and make it a part of our daily lives. Only then is the Gospel truly alive. The doors of our church are a most sacred part of the church. Leaving without living the gospel is an empty participation. Living out the Gospel has always taken courage. Our rich history is full of the stories of those who gave their lives for Jesus, and those who dedicated the rest of their lives in service of it. Listen for the whispered quiet invitation of the Holy Spirit. The Church lives on in mysterious and beautiful ways. It is never too late to begin. Just let grace happen. And may the Holy Communion we share with one another whether in person or spiritually give us the strength and courage to carry on our mission as disciples of Jesus.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an invitation to the Our Lady of Fatima Prayer Vigil on Monday, July 12, the Litany of St. Joseph and other prayers, an order form for the next round of Parish Picks which will begin in August, registration info for CYO Swimming, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.




Today we celebrate the memorial of the Franciscan saint -St. Bonaventure.
