

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The focus of today's readings is to help us understand the many ways that each of us can share the Good News of Jesus and point the way for others to the kingdom of heaven. In the first reading from Wisdom, the power of God is shown through acts of mercy, kindness, and patience. Knowing the weakness of humanity God chose to judge with clemency rather than with punishment. "But though you are master of might, you judge with clemency, and with much lenience you govern us; for power, whenever you will, attends you." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul understands the limitations of the human condition especially when it comes to prayer. He espouses the intercession of the Holy Spirit to help us. "And the one who searches hearts knows what the intention of the Spirit is, because he intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will." And finally, Matthew's gospel continues Jesus teaching through parables. He uses the imagery of weeds and wheat, then one of the mustard seed and yeast. The weeds and wheat parable has Jesus affirming that the kingdom of heaven contains both saints and sinners and God alone will make the final determination of judgement. And the mustard seed and yeast examples are meant to offer insight into the growth process of the kingdom of heaven. It is only partially fulfilled in the here and now but there is much more to come. Only through faith can one understand the deeper meanings of these parables. It is important for the listeners to take heed of what Jesus says. "I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world."

We live in a world that includes the good and the bad, the easy and the difficult, the sinners and the saints. Our call is to remain true to who we are as daughters and sons of God and signs of Jesus to the world. How we bear the Good News of Jesus to others is what counts. A cup of coffee, a visit to a nursing home, a round of golf, a playdate, shopping, a neighborhood picnic-all these are opportunities to share the Good News of the kingdom of heaven. Every day we can share this news through acts of thoughtfulness with the gift of time in many ways and places. God has given each of us, from the youngest to the oldest, gifts and talents to use in sharing the Good News. I have witnessed countless times the gifts and talents of parishioners that have been incredible examples of sharing the Good News. Jesus had many followers, and he knew them.

He also knew what symbols and stories would speak to their experiences and what would be hard for them to comprehend. He knows that about you and me too. In the first reading today, God is spoken of as someone who is just, lenient, and merciful. It describes a God who gives hope to his children. If we are to be the followers of Jesus, we too should be extending these gifts to others. Leniency instead of revenge? Justice instead of injustice? Hope instead of gloom? When we do this, that is how we point the way to heaven. Jesus gave us the gift of his Body and Blood that we might know the fullness of God's mercy and love, preparing us to one day share in the great banquet in the kingdom of heaven.

I hope everyone is staying safe and doing the best you can in dealing with the coronavirus. I know that everything is difficult for all of us and we are trying to do as well as we can. Mass attendance is slightly better as the weeks go on. It is extremely good to be able to pray with those who can come. The restrictions are tedious but at least we are able to worship as our parish community. And if you cannot come because of age or vulnerable health conditions know we still all pray together. Please continue to pray with the Mass on tv or online and make the Spiritual Communion as you pray. Let us also continue to pray for all who suffer from the virus at this time. May they be healed and restored to good health. And let us always pray for those in the medical field who care for the sick and risk their lives every day. May they also be kept safe and given the necessary strength to meet the demands of each day.

Please take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass or read it online. There is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry and info from Religious Education plus an order form for the new round of Parish Picks that begins in August. Your help with this fund raiser is greatly appreciated. And thanks for your continued generosity during these difficult months. Without your financial support we would never make it.
