



Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessing on the Second Sunday of Lent! Today's focus is on the sacrificial importance during the Lenten season. We give up something for a greater good just as God did for us. In the first reading from Genesis, we have God testing Abraham's faith by telling him to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. When Abraham proves his faith, God stops the sacrifice from happening, then God showers praise and blessings in abundance upon Abraham. "I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." Then in the second reading from Romans, we are told that God did not spare his own Son from death. Jesus is now the perfect intercessor to the Father on our behalf. "Christ Jesus it is who died, or rather was raised, who is also at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us." And finally, Mark's gospel is the story of the Transfiguration. Here the divinity of Jesus is clarified. In a sense, Mark interrupts the story to show us how it will end. Together the law and the prophets express the fullness of divine revelation. The presence of Jesus symbolizes that he is the fullness of divine revelation. "Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice: This is my beloved son. Listen to him."

Remember how in the movie, It's a Wonderful Life. George Bailey gives up his desire to go to college and instead stays to take over the family business after his father dies? Instead, his brother goes to college and has a successful career while George struggles at home. But in the end viewers see that George didn't give up; instead, he gained in countless ways. I think we can all identify with this story. Someone donates a kidney for someone on dialysis. Parents giving up sleep to care for a sick child or a teenager gives up his paycheck to his single mom to meet family expenses. On the other hand, we almost instinctively think of our own well-being first. Sacrifice is not something that comes easily. Now in the first reading. Abraham's love for and trust in God is total. And in the second reading we see God's love for us being described by the sacrifice of his Son for us. Because God did give his Son, we have someone who is always for us. Then the gospel shows God's love for his Son. The Transfiguration affirms this love when a voice from a cloud says, "This is my Son, whom I love, listen to him." Imagine the feeling of Peter, James and John coming down from the mountain.

It was an experience of such closeness with God that they didn't want it to end. For us having a moment when God's presence is felt is not unlike what these apostles felt. It is a closeness with God that we don't want to end. So, understanding better what sacrifice means and how love is paramount, let us come to Jesus with hearts open to his transforming love and mercy.

Two weeks from today on March 14th, the Fourth Sunday of Lent we will have a special "Gift Card Sunday" for the benefit of Parish Social Ministry and the Human Life Committee. I am asking if possible that in addition to your regular parish contributions given in the baskets at Mass that you also give a gift card that will help these two parish ministries. Now the only gift cards we are asking for are Stop and Shop for Parish Social Ministry and either Walmart or Target for the Human Life Committee. Gift cards from any of these three places would be greatly appreciated to help those from our community who are in need. So, remember: Gift Card Sunday will be on March 14th, the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

The first round of *Parish Picks* was held last Monday and \$2000 was won by some very lucky parishioners. What! You don't' have any numbers yet. Well, there are still five more months of winners to be picked. Just fill out the form found in the bulletin and send it in to the rectory. Numbers will be assigned to you right away and you will be set for the next five months. *Remember: You gotta be in it to win it!*

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Second Week of Lent. Smile, pray, fast, and help someone in need. Plus remember: If you're headed in the wrong direction, God allows U-turns. God bless always.

Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. Help me, Jesus, to really understand all that You have done for me. Help me to make my burden lighter.

THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

How does anyone have the strength to watch someone they love suffer and die? Death knows no boundaries and takes everyone. I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Please help me to be nicer to those who are against me, and let me be trusting in my relationships with my friends, family and neighbors. I have enough to handle on my own. Why, then, am I further burdened with worry about family members or friends? Why does it always seem to be me who has to take on their problems as well as my own? Lord, show me the way.

THE SIXTH STATION-VERONICA WIPES THE FACE OF JESUS

Every day I see people who are suffering or in need of help. They seem to be everywhere. I wish someone would help them. I'm so busy; I just don's have the time. That isn't really true. I guess I just don't want to be involved. I have my own problems, I don't need to take on any more. O Lord, teach me to see Your face in the faces of those who need comfort. You have assured us that random acts of kindness will have their own rewards, if not here and now, then later, with you in the kingdom.





THE SEVENTH STATION-JESUS FALLS AGAIN

In spite of my best intentions, I am so weak and fall again. I try to do the right thing, but temptations are so strong. I know, when Jesus stumbles and falls, He is suffering greatly. He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. With Your help, I can have the courage and the faith to get up again and continue on. Help me to pray that I will not follow my own way but, instead, the way of the Lord, for which Jesus was sacrificed.

THE EIGHTH STATION-JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

How difficult I find it sometimes to think of others particularly when I am troubled or hurting. Sometimes I get so wrapped up in myself that I shut others out, and I wonder if I can go on. Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain **entirely** from meat/ poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on **Ash Wednesday** and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** fast and abstinence.


St. Raymond **Human Life Committee**


The Rose for Life Program

Hopefully, each of the children will see improvement in their scores showing the growth we anticipate. This is the schedule for the Comps: Monday - 6th Science, 7th SS, and 8th Math and LA; Tuesday - 6th SS and Math, 7th Lit and Science, 8th Science and SS; Wednesday-6th ELA, 7th Math and LA, and 8th Lit. The students are well aware of the schedule.

I would like to remind our 8th graders and their parents that the annual Sodality Scholarship test is being given on-line from 4-5 pm on Thursday, March 11th. Everyone must register ahead of time. Please follow through with this special opportunity.

Have a peaceful second week of Lent. Pray for all in need of our prayers, especially the sick and suffering throughout our world. Know our prayers are joined to yours.
