

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time! This Sunday's readings challenge us to decide whether we will live and grow in our covenant relationship with God or just let it atrophy. In the first reading from Sirach, the human ability to choose is emphasized. God has given us all the divine graces needed to make the best of choices. The first choice we have to make is whether to trust in God or not. "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul reminds the people that the wisdom of God is beyond anything in this world. It takes spiritual maturity to recognize it. "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him, this God has revealed to us through the Spirit." And finally, Matthew's gospel account continues the Sermon on the Mount. Here Jesus offers teaching that is seen from the perspective of the kingdom of heaven. The focus is on righteousness, not literal interpretations. When Jesus says, "You have heard that it was said..." he follows with, "But I say to you..." Jesus requires everyone to get below the surface of the teaching and be challenged by its deeper meaning.

One of the most amazing things about how we are made in the image and likeness of God is that we have free will. And it is this continuous gift of free will that separates us from the rest of creation. Now with this great gift comes great responsibility. We must choose if we will follow the law of Moses and the prophets or if we will follow the latest trend. Now, when it comes to making choices, we also have the freedom to be open to the Spirit of God who reveals the will of God to us. Everyday we make choices that are not really life or death, yet we spend much time and energy settling upon a choice. Just consider how you decide what to buy when shopping. Now, if we only spent as much time discerning the choices we make in our relationship with God and each other in daily life! For us as Christians, it is Jesus who helps us grow in our relationship with God and one another. The decisions we make affect our relationship with God and one another because we are part of a community, namely, the Church. It makes all the difference how we use our free will to choose life over death, to act justly or unjustly, to do good or evil. We come together around the table of the Lord to continue receiving this gift of "new and everlasting covenant." But we do not simply come here for prideful individualism. This new and everlasting covenant will help us mature in the wisdom of the Lord, so that we may always make life giving choices.

As you may already know, the diocese recently announced a new endeavor aimed at revitalizing our Catholic Elementary Schools. It is called *The Morning Star Initiative* which under the mantle of Mary the Morning Star, will work for a new dawn of Catholic education across Long Island. There are brochures located on the pew shelves of the church which spells out this new initiative. In addition, there is a special website that you can look at to see all that is happening. The link can be found on our own parish website. Let us pray that Mary, the Morning Star will inspire us to this new dawn for our Catholic schools.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an invitation for our eighth graders to apply for the Sodality of Our Lady Scholarship Exam, the ever present invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand-it's free!), an order form for the new round of Parish Picks which starts this month and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great week. Smile, share, help someone in need and make good and faith filled choices. Plus remember: Backsliding begins when knee bending ends. God bless always.
