Father Chuck's Corner

Alleluia! Jesus Christ is Risen Today! Happy Easter to everyone. Well, it sure is a different Easter this year than in 2020. Last year our church, while decorated as usual, was silent without the usual throngs of people coming to Mass on Easter Sunday. There were no "Happy Easter" greetings, no singing the "Alleluia" music of Easter by our Adult Choir or Folk Group. Yes, it sure was different. And this year while much better is different from years past. We still have the distance seating with every other row taped off. Everyone must wear a mask and there are no missalettes to sing along from. The services for Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday were celebrated but with certain restrictions and modifications. But you know what? We are here and all who came to Easter Mass showed a joy and gratitude for the gift of salvation that we acknowledge by the resurrection of Jesus. While we still battle COVID-19 and its effects on our health and well-being, we still practice social distance and get vaccinated to hasten victory over this virus, today we acknowledge that Jesus has saved us and is with us in a powerful and graced

Easter is the day when we pay special attention to our Baptism which calls us to step over the obstacles of race, creed, and personal prejudice to build relationships where we encounter Jesus with and through one another. *Divisiveness and resentments* have no real place in an Easter person. The Resurrection of Jesus has unlocked the love of Jesus that shows us that God's love has no boundaries or partiality. It is interesting that the disciples were surprised to find the tomb empty. Remember that these were the ones who witnessed how Jesus walked on water, multiplied fish and bread, and turned water into wine. Yet now they are surprised, when he had told them time and again that he would rise from the dead in three days. Once again, Jesus has shocked them, moving far beyond their expectations. All of us too encounter Jesus in surprising ways and perhaps most surprising of all is that others can encounter Jesus in each of us.

The Gospels emphasize how much Jesus wanted to be with people face-to-face. He revealed how much God values every person, regardless of ethnicity, gender, or sinfulness. Jesus could not be bound by earthly trappings of rich or poor, gentile or Jew. He even broke free from the bonds of death. No one will find him in the tomb. Jesus will find his disciples in the coming days. In the same way, Jesus is with us, even when we are not looking for him. He is ready to always meet us where we are. Jesus loved his disciples more than they could ever know.

These beloved friends of Jesus will share stories of Jesus and announce the good news that he has risen from death. None of us should stare wide-eyed and silent, staring at an empty tomb. Our Easter celebration shouts out that we believe in the presence of Jesus alive in the world. So just like Jesus we must reject bias and judgement, deliberately meeting people face-to-face, with acceptance and love as Jesus did. May our encounter with Jesus this Easter transform our hearts into that of Jesus for all those we encounter every day.

Thanks to all who took chances for our "Pot of Gold 50/50" last month. The winning ticket was puled last Sunday afternoon which was F1613. The pot had reached \$4130.00 so the winning share was \$2065.00. Congratulations! Look for our next "Go for the Green 50'50" coming next month.

Even though parish life has been curtailed and restricted quite a bit this past year, I know that many ministries have still been able to function to some degree. Our **School and Religious Educa**tion Program have both been able to continue teaching our children either in person or via zoom classes and we are preparing to celebrate First Holy Communion for over 100 second graders in a couple of weeks. Our *Parish Social Ministry* has been able to maintain services to those in need throughout the pandemic and our *Ministry of Consolation* has always been able to help those suffering from the loss of a loved one in planning Funeral Masses. Our *Music Ministry* has continued to assist at all Masses and Services especially during Christmas and this Holy Week and Easter, as well as *Lectors* and Ushers and EME's when called upon. Our church is beautifully cared for and decorated once again to enhance everyone's prayer experiences when coming to Mass or for a visit. I know that while meetings have been scarce to none, the spirit of many ministries has continued through prayer chains and the magic of zoom. Hopefully in time more will be happening here for all of us.





Easter 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord is truly risen, Alleluia! Around the world and across Long Island, we proclaim this marvelous truth. Good news is ours. Sin and death have been vanquished. Christ has conquered. God is victorious!

In light of the suffering and death of the past year, how blessed we are to behold again the Mystery of the Resurrection. These months have been dark and bleak. They have been long and challenging. Yet, as we encounter Easter 2021, we are reminded that God has the final word. Indeed, *Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:5)*. This Light, Jesus Christ, illumines our path. He gives hope. As the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council said:

Through Christ and in Christ, the riddles of sorrow and death grow meaningful. Apart from His Gospel, they overwhelm us. Chris has risen, destroying death by His death; He has lavished life upon us so that...we can cry out in the Spirit: Abba, Father.

With significant challenges facing us still on Long Island and across the globe, with darkness still afoot, perhaps the joy of Easter is difficult to embrace. Our hearts maybe like those of the disciples who went on Easter dawn to anoint the Lord's body. At the strange sight of an empty tomb and an apparently absent Jesus, instead of experiencing immediate joy, they were confused and distressed. Only in seeing the Lord face to face did they come to embrace His rising from the dead.

Like Mary Magdalene and the other disciples, we need to see Christ alive among us. We need to see the Resurrection in our midst. So, this Easter, let us ask, "Where is Christ alive?"

Christ is alive in the countless frontline workers, civil servants, and medical professionals who have served so faithfully and so heroically this past year. Their sacrificial love and Good Samaritan-willingness to help neighbors in need radiate the Lord Jesus!

Christ is alive in the catechumens who have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Their reception of the Sacraments reminds us of the power of our own Baptism--where each of us had died with Christ and risen with Him to new life.

Above all, Christ is alive in His risen and glorified presence in the Eucharist and in the transforming power of His Body and Blood that we received in the celebration of the Mass. Christ is alive, and therefore the Church is alive. The Eucharist is the source of this life--and its power has become perhaps more evident than ever, after months of separation from the weekly and daily celebration of the Mass. Together, we recall the disciples' recognition of Jesus following the Resurrection of Emmaus in the opening ways in which our parishes and schools have continued to foster creatively this Emmaus experience on Long Island, both in-person and virtually. May we continue to recognize the Sunday Eucharist as the source from which the life of the Resurrected Christ bursts forth into the world.

At his Sunday Angelus on January 3, 2021, Pope Francis beautifully reminded us of Christ's continued presence in our midst:

"I like to think that when the Lord prays to the Father for us, he does not merely speak: he shows him the wounds of the flesh, he shows him the wounds he suffered for us. This is Jesus: with his flesh he is the intercessor, he wanted to bear even the signs of suffering. Jesus, with his flesh, is before the Father. Indeed, the Gospel says that *He came to dwell among us*. He did not come to visit us, and then leave; He came to dwell with us, to stay with us".

May we continue to encounter the presence of Jesus Christ who dwells in and through His Church. May we continue to experience signs of His Resurrection even amidst the challenges and crosses we embrace, and may this encounter continue to fill our hearts, so that our voices can confidently cry out:



Slavery: "A slave is the property of the owner & can be bought, sold used or even killed by the owner at the owner's discretion."

Abortion: A baby only becomes a legal person when he is born and in some cases now even If the baby is lucky to be born after the abortion (live-birth), even then the baby's life is still in jeopardy in some states.

Slavery: If you think slavery is wrong, nobody is forcing you to own slaves. But don't impose your morality on someone else!

Abortion: If you think abortion is wrong, nobody is forcing you to have one. But don't impose your morality on someone else!

Slavery: 11 years later in 1868, the 14th Amendment was enacted to right this dreadful wrong!

Abortion: Over 4 decades (45 years) have passed since the Supreme Court made its infamous and deadly abortion decision.

We have repeated history. Same old arguments, same old rationales, Just a different segment of our human family. How much longer is it going to take us to recognize and return protection to the vulnerable, innocent, voiceless little ones?

To overturn the injustice to the babies in the womb?






