Father Chuck's Corner

God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday of Easter. And Happy Mother's Day to all our beloved mothers. We honor the memory of all our mothers who have died and pay tribute to all our mothers who are with us and loving us each day in their special way. It is love that is the focus of today's readings; the fact that God loves all equally and we should also. In the first reading from Acts, Peter is quite clear that God's love is poured out equally amongst all people. Jesus died for all people, no matter race, creed, or color. Peter takes the lead in proclaiming the inclusivity of salvation for all people and it is shown by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the gentiles. "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" Then in the second reading from 1 John, John stresses how important it is to love one another with the same love Jesus had. In this way we imitate the love God extended to us. And the love of God is shown by his sending Jesus into the world so that we may have life through him. "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God." And finally, John's gospel continues the reflection of Jesus on the relationship between God the Father. Jesus and his disciples. Access to the Father's love comes by being connected to Jesus. Again, remaining in his love is the key and is shown by the way we love one another. The result is that we will be friends of Jesus and have a joy that is described as complete. "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love."

So, love is the main theme of today's readings which is a good one for Mother's Day, for our mothers who mirror the unconditional love of God for us. However, love seems to be in short supply these days. Nations are divided. Political parties seem more adversarial than cooperative. Many families are divided by divorce or lifestyles. It becomes most important to look at God's love so we can strive to imitate it. God loves us all equally. Salvation is a gift open to all who desire it: any person, of any race, any economic state, any religion, any orientation, any political persuasion, sinners, and saints. God loves each person unconditionally! This kind of love is so far beyond the love any of us can muster. Now, this truth that God shows no partiality is the challenge given for us also to do. Remember that God became human so we could return to God.

And Jesus gave his life, out of love, to show us how to love. First of all, it is sacrificial, and in so many ways. Sometimes it is more challenging us to die to self in our daily lives. We show love by the way we handle intrusions on our time and by the way we respond to co-workers. We show it by the courtesy we extend to drivers who cut us off or how we put the needs of a spouse or child or neighbor before our own. And a tricky one, especially in our times is how we disagree agreeably with people holding different political or religious opinions. Loving and accepting behavior are not the same because love is much more than agreement or approval. God is very clear. He does not condone sin, but he loves sinners unconditionally. And he loves us regardless of our choices. He lets us exercise our free will even when our choices are unwise or sinful. We need to all remember that we cannot make God stop loving us, thank God! But we can refuse his love. God's love can only really touch us if we are receptive to it. And once we receive his love, we need to be lovers as well. Remember that God loved us first. We can't earn it or deserve it. But we can share it and that makes all the difference.

This weekend we celebrate the last of our *First Holy Communion Masses*. Like I always say this is the most important day in the life of a Catholic. These children, from this day forward are as close to Jesus as one can get in this world. From now on they can receive the spiritual strength needed to live lives of faith, hope and love. May our children who have received for the first time be filled with the love of and for Jesus all the days of their lives.



The tradition goes back to the time when the Apostles, the Blessed Mother, and the early Christian Church prayed before Pentecost Sunday. Some Novenas to the Holy Spirit include: The Coming of the Holy Spirit, Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and Fruits of the Holy Spirit. Pope Leo XIII issued an encyclical on the Holy Spirit to have Novena throughout the Church in preparation for Pentecost.
