


Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's Holy Week blessings be **yours!** Today we reach the beginning of this holiest of weeks with the celebration of Palm Sunday. Jesus reached the culmination of his journey to Jerusalem with a triumphal entry, followed by his suffering, death and resurrection. We now try to walk with Jesus through Holy Week in the pattern of his death and resurrection, to renew our baptismal commitment. The first reading from Isaiah shows how even during challenges, the word of God will prevail. Those who commit to being servants of the Lord do so with confidence, knowing that God's truth must be heard. "The Lord is my help; therefore, I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame." Then in the second reading from Philippians, Paul talks of the humility of Jesus walking among us and dying on a cross. "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped." And finally, we have Luke's version of the passion narrative. Luke's story of the suffering and death of Jesus is an important conclusion to the earlier gospel passage which highlights Jesus' royal entry into Jerusalem. His journey to Jerusalem is a long one in Luke's gospel, covering 10 chapters. It was necessary for Jesus to get to Jerusalem to fulfill his divine prophetic mission, achieved though his suffering, death and resurrection. "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest." It is necessary that Jesus follow in the footsteps of the prophets who went before him as he is portrayed by Luke as God's innocent prophet.

Throughout Luke's passion account we see Jesus emptying himself. He is thinking not of himself but of others. He tells his disciples not to argue about who is the greatest among them. He prays for Peter before his denial. He warns Judas before the betrayal and responds as a hurt friend at the moment of betrayal. He comforts the women weeping at the side of the road to Calvary. He asks his Father to forgive those who are nailing him to the cross. He promises paradise to the criminal crucified at his side. This is how Jesus triumphed over sin and death. He gave himself in love. And for this reason, God gave him a name above every other name.

This is more than a walk down memory lane. It is a renewed immersion in the events into which our

baptism has initiated us. It is a recovery of the strength of our faith, which tends to get injured and grow weak over time. It is a renewal of our commitment to empty ourselves with Christ, to serve and not be served, to die daily so as to live with him forever. Let us walk with Jesus to the heavenly Jerusalem and the Easter



Morn that dawns after the Good Friday that must certainly precede it. At every Eucharist we pattern ourselves after the model of Jesus Christ. *Every Eucharist is Holy Week in miniature*. When we eat this saving bread and drink this holy cup, we proclaim his death until he comes into our pattern of living; until his ways become our ways and his triumph extends to us and to the whole world.



Then follow the schedule for the special Triduum Services on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and the Easter Sunday Masses. We hope to see you often during these holiest days of the Church year.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. Besides the Holy Week schedule, it contains many other items of information and invitation. Of additional note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, how to use the envelopes for the Easter Masses of Remembrance, info from the Human Life Committee, an ad for the Divine Mercy Service on Sunday, April 28th, an invitation to the start of new Bereavement Ministry Sessions, an ad for the upcoming Parish Blood Drive on Sunday, May 5th and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Holy Week filled with God's special graces and blessings. Come to church often to pray and celebrate these holiest mysteries of our faith. And remember: Every day will not be good, but there is something good in every day. God bless always.
