### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fourth Sunday of Lent! Today's focus is to instill hope in the possibility of conversion and trust in the promise of salvation through the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus. In the first reading from 2 Chronicles, God laments the infidelity of his people and the ruin of Jerusalem. And even with God's anger and sadness, there is still compassion and hope given to the people through King Cyrus of Persia. "All the kingdoms of the earth the Lord, God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah." Then in the second reading from Ephesians, Paul marvels at the many gifts we enjoy from God's abundant grace. New life was given in Jesus, even when we were dead because of sin. And now we are created to lead a life of good deeds. "For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them." And finally, John's gospel has Jesus talking to the Pharisee, Nicodemus, who cannot understand how a person can be born again. Jesus speaks of the great love of God in giving his Son as a gift so that all who believe in him may have eternal life. "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

There is a long history of God's people turning from him again and again from the earliest of biblical times. Yet no matter how far or how long people turn from God, conversion and eternal life are always possible. Why? Because of Jesus Christ! Sometimes when we read of a death bed conversion, we may wonder why it took so long. The usual answer is that the person was too busy for God during life. Through Adam and Eve, through the Israelites right up to you and me; God never abandons us. God always waited patiently for the Israelites to turn back to him. God had made a covenant with his people and he always remained faithful. Even a death bed conversion delights God and that person is welcomed into God's loving embrace.



Remember that God gave his only Son for the sake of our salvation. Jesus was lifted up on the cross to save all of us; past, present, and future. This instrument of shame and agony became an instrument of exaltation and glory. The crucifixion and resurrection are God's gift to the world and those who believe in his promise will be richly rewarded. People may refuse to believe in Jesus' death and resurrection, but the truth can never be diminished. Hope always remains for those who turn to God, even if it is at the last minute. But why wait?

Today is "Gift Card Sunday" when we asked everyone coming to Mass to bring a gift card from either Stop and Shop, Walmart or Target to help our Parish Social Ministry and Human Life Committee in their outreach to people in need. If you forgot this Sunday, you can certainly still bring gift cards to Mass next week or drop them off at the rectory during regular office hours. Your help in this Lenten practice of almsgiving is most appreciated.

This coming Friday, March 19<sup>th</sup> is the Feast of St. Joseph. In honor of St. Joseph, we will have a special period of Eucharistic Adoration on the 19<sup>th</sup> immediately after the 12:15pm Mass until 3pm. In this year of St. Joseph as proclaimed by Pope Francis, it is very fitting for us to spend some time with his Son, Jesus while asking for St. Joseph's powerful intercession on his feast day. Come and spend some time as you "Go to Joseph" in prayer on Friday. Also, there are some very good videos on St. Joseph that you can enjoy on FORMED. So, sign up if you have not already. It' free!

Remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many other items of interest and information with something for everyone. Of additional note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks, an ad about the Pot of Gold 50/50, an update about the 2021 Catholic Ministries Appeal, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Fourth week of Lent. Keep that Lenten smile going as you practice forgiveness and patience. Plus remember: God likes it when you smile, but he loves it when he is the reason. God bless always.

### **READINGS FOR TODAY'S MASS**

SUNDAY, MARCH 14, 2021 FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

#### FIRST READING

2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and In writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!'

# THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS STATIONS 1-7



#### THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

#### THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





#### THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. Help me, Jesus, to really understand all that You have done for me. Help me to make my burden lighter.

#### THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

How does anyone have the strength to watch someone they love suffer and die? Death knows no boundaries and takes everyone. I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





#### THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Please help me to be nicer to those who are against me, and let me be trusting in my relationships with my friends, family and neighbors. I have enough to handle on my own. Why, then, am I further burdened with worry about family members or friends? Why does it always seem to be me who has to take on their problems as well as my own? Lord, show me the way.

#### THE SIXTH STATION-VERONICA WIPES THE FACE OF JESUS

Every day I see people who are suffering or in need of help. They seem to be everywhere. I wish someone would help them. I'm so busy; I just don's have the time. That isn't really true. I guess I just don't want to be involved. I have my own problems, I don't need to take on any more. O Lord, teach me to see Your face in the faces of those who need comfort. You have assured us that random acts of kindness will have their own rewards, if not here and now, then later, with you in the kingdom.





#### THE SEVENTH STATION-JESUS FALLS AGAIN

In spite of my best intentions, I am so weak and fall again. I try to do the right thing, but temptations are so strong. I know, when Jesus stumbles and falls, He is suffering greatly. He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. With Your help, I can have the courage and the faith to get up again and continue on. Help me to pray that I will not follow my own way but, instead, the way of the Lord, for which Jesus was sacrificed.

#### THE EIGHTH STATION-JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

How difficult I find it sometimes to think of others particularly when I am troubled or hurting. Sometimes I get so wrapped up in myself that I shut others out, and I wonder if I can go on. Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



#### THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

#### THE TENTH STATION-JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS

My possessions are very important to me. I surround myself with beautiful and expensive things. I have far more clothes than I really need, and sometimes I spend money on silly things and forget about others who don't even have necessities. Dear Jesus, you not only sacrificed everything, You laid down Your life for me. Help me to be a strong spiritual follower in faith. Please show me the right way towards eternal happiness by following Your example.





#### THE ELEVENTH STATION-JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS

O, my God, sometimes I persecute others because they are different. I am embarrassed when I think of some of the things I've said about others. It's so easy to gossip. Sometimes I just don't like people because of their skin color or religion. Give me the courage to not give in to the pressures of putting others down. Dear Jesus, please forgive me and the others like me, and help me, instead to be Your messenger of love and care to all I meet so that they may experience Your love and concern through me.

#### THE TWELFTH STATION-JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS

Jesus, give me the strength so that I can survive the mysteries of life that are ahead of me. I know I'm going to fall many times. Give me the courage to stand back up. Let me recognize all the good things that surround me each day of my life. Our heavenly Father gave all of us a beautiful world. You even died so our sins would be forgiven. May I be like You in Your perfect example of sacrifice and love. Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.





#### THE THIRTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS

Lord I am truly sorry for forgetting You. I am sometimes preoccupied by my life when I should be focusing on You. I really don't know why, but I always seem to let all the things in my life crowd you out. Often, when I do pray, I do not concentrate on my prayer. I sometimes just say the words and don't pay attention to what I am saying. Help me to show that You are my first priority by setting aside time for You each day.

#### THE FOURTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS LAID IN THE TOMB

Dear Jesus, following Your death, helplessness and despair was felt by many. Your death on the cross left those who really knew You empty inside. 

All are invited to spend time with St. Joseph who spent his life as the earthly father of Jesus in Perpetual Adoration. May St. Joseph favor us with his powerful intercession now and throughout the year. So, come to church and

in prayer on Friday, March 19th.

This is how an indulgence is defined in the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (# 1471): "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints".

The *Plenary Indulgence* is granted during the Year of St Joseph:

- 1. 1.to those who shall contemplate the Lord's Prayer for at least 30 minutes
- 2. 2 to those who participate in a Spiritual Retreat of at least one day which involves a meditation on Saint Joseph
- 3. 3. to those who, after the example of Saint Joseph, shall fulfill a work of corporal or spiritual work of mercy
- to those who recite the Holy Rosary in families and among betrothed;
- 5. to those who shall daily entrust their life to the protection of Saint Joseph
- to the faithful who shall invoke through prayer the intercession of St Joseph, the Worker of Nazareth, so that those in search of work may find employment and the work of all people may be more dignified
- 7. to the faithful who shall recite the Litany to Saint Joseph or some other prayer to Saint Joseph, in favor of the Church persecuted and for the relief of all Christians who suffer any form of persecution
- 8. To the faithful who shall recite any prayer legitimately approved or act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph, for example, "To you, O Blessed Joseph"
  - on March 19
  - on May 1
  - on the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph,
  - on the 19th of every month
  - on any Wednesday, the day dedicated to the Saint's memory
- 9. to the elderly, the sick, the suffering and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave the house.

# Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain **entirely** from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from
