Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the First **Sunday of Lent!** The readings this Sunday try to affirm that we are all beloved by God. We struggle throughout our lives trying to understand: "Who am **!?"** God reminds us over and over that we are his beloved children. In the first reading from Genesis, we see how God created everything good and paid attentive care to humanity. However, by the end of the reading a dramatic change has taken place in the relationship between man and God. "Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; so, they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves." Then in the second reading from Romans, we are shown that through disobedience death reigned over the world; but through the obedience of Jesus comes the saving plan of life. "In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so, through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all." And finally, in Matthew's gospel, we have the story of Jesus being tempted by the devil. These are the temptations Jesus faced throughout his ministry. The upshot of the three temptations is that the devil will not give up, but he also will never succeed. "Then the devil left him and, behold, angels came and ministered to him."

The question of our primary identity is at the heart of our spiritual lives and of today's readings. Our original and ongoing struggle is to accept our identity as God's beloved. When Adam and Eve were persuaded to doubt their identity in God, disobedience soon followed. The temptations in the gospel are attempts by the devil to undercut the identity of Jesus as God's Son. Jesus knew who he was; he knew he was God's beloved Son in whom God was well pleased, and he did not fall into the devil's lies. We are called to reject these same lies and accept our primary identity as beloved children of God. We are also called to know who we are, not simply as individuals, but also in community. Belonging to the beloved community of the Church means that we see each other, even those most marginalized and cast out of society, as God's beloved.

Jesus' victory can also be ours. Through the Eucharist, God wants us to accept, know and experience his unconditional love for us. No matter how young or old you are it can be difficult to accept God's never ending and powerful love.

Today, God claims you by a truth infinitely more powerful than any of this world's lies: *You are his beloved child!* God who fashioned us out of love now calls us to this banquet as his family. We give him thanks every time we come home to his table.

The first week of Lent 2020 is underway and that means we will be starting our spread-out Forty Hours Adoration. We begin Monday, March 2nd immediately after the 12:15pm Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the main altar from 1pm till 9pm each of the next five Mondays. There will be the *Divine Mercy Chaplet* prayed at 3pm and the *Rosary* prayed at 5pm each of these Monday's. *Confessions* will be heard from 7-8pm and at 8pm a **Lenten Reflection** will be offered by one of the priests or deacons. Then Exposition will conclude with **Benediction** at 9pm. This will be repeated each Monday for five weeks. Check the bulletin ad for further details. This Sunday also begins our special "Giving, Not Giving Up.....It's a Lenten Thing" program at all the Masses. Today, food donations have been requested. Everyone is asked to bring their food donations to the altar at the Offertory as a tangible sign of the community's self-giving. Next week we are asking for "Toiletry Items" with the same procedure being followed. Check the bulletin for each week's request.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of additional note is the full Lenten Schedule, an invitation to the "Night at The Races" next Saturday, March 7th, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks (not too late to get in it!), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great First Week of Lent! Get that Lenten smile going as a beloved child of God. And remember: Backsliding begins when knee bending ends. God bless always.

Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth

year are bound to abstain **entirely** from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday.** This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

LENT 2020

Dear Friends,

The season of Lent offers us a sacred time for contemplating what it means to accompany Our Lord as he carries the Cross.

During his Passion, we see Christ laboring under the burden of our sufferings and of those whom we love. As the prophet Isaiah says, "He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows" (cf. Is 53:4), and he still carries them today. Perhaps this year we might pray for the grace to accompany more closely our neighbors and loved ones who are suffering, and so participate in Christ's own sacrificial love as he shoulders their burdens.

Throughout our Diocese there are many who are suffering. We know this. Every parish has its stories of families experiencing hardship and loss. Our hospitals and shelters have their stories. Our nursing homes and schools have theirs. Indeed, we find the Cross in our own homes. Our parents and grandparents know heartache, and our children have burdens as well. Our Lord carries them all.

Perhaps you know a person who is sick or grieving the loss of a loved one. Maybe you know someone who is suffering from addiction or depression and is tempted to despair. Perhaps you know of someone who is lonely or has been altogether abandoned. It is good to remember that Our Lord is carrying each of them already with great love, placing his sheep on his shoulders (cf. Lk 15:5). And this Good Shepherd invites us to accompany him in holiness that we might share more fully in his mission.

Consider the figure of Simon of Cyrene. We know him from the Fifth Station of the Cross and from the Synoptic Gospels. He was compelled to carry the Cross of Christ (cf. Mt 27:32; Mk 15:21; Lk 23:26). We recognize his initial fear; it is the same as our own. We do not fault Simon for his resistance. Helping Jesus could not have been easy. And yet with God's grace what began as servitude was transformed into a gesture of compassion, even a sublime privilege.

To be sure, we may have cause to be fearful of accompanying Christ under the Cross. Social stigmas associated with some sufferings may cause us to stay away. We might fear our own inadequacies; weaknesses and wounds can cause self-doubt. We may even feel some degree of responsibility for the person's suffering: "I could have done more ". Simon would have experienced these fears as Christ was passing by. Indeed, he needed to be driven by the Roman soldiers to accompany Jesus (cf. Mk 15:21). But the gaze of Christ prevailed on Simon and moved him beyond his fear.

Christ himself prayed in the garden before taking up the Cross, "Father if it be possible, let this cup pass but he saw the Father's love for humanity and was moved to pray, "yet not as I will, but as you will" (cf. Mt 26:39). Love bends the will to the other. It was Christ's love that changed Simon's servitude into sacrifice. And it is Christ's love that can transform our fear into accompaniment.

As your bishop, I have the privilege of seeing that so many of you are already living as Simon, already accompanying Christ who carries the burdens of your neighbors and loved ones. I visit your homes and pray with you in your parishes. I witness your dedication to the people of your ministries and organizations. And I see that many of you, like Simon, allow the gaze of Christ to draw you underneath the weight of the Cross, where your own servitude becomes a privileged encounter with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and an encouragement to us all.

In light of this witness, I wish to bring particular attention to the newly formed Morning Star Initiative, designed to revitalize Catholic elementary school education on Long Island. I ask all of you to pray for our parishes and schools, our administrators and teachers, our students and their families, and all who are promoting a bold new era of Catholic education and evangelization on Long Island.

This way of sharing in the life of Christ moves us beyond imitation into a real participation with him in his relationship with the Father. The Cross is not a punishment to be endured; it is a decision to love. "He was pierced for our transgressions. He was crushed for our iniquities" (cf. Is 53:5). And when we move in this way toward others in their need, our experience of their suffering is transformed from a burden into an encounter with love. We find, with Simon, that our servitude becomes a mysterious privilege of accompaniment. Underneath the weight of a cross carried with love, we see Jesus.

Too often we feel regret for not drawing near to those who are suffering. Let us pray during this holy season, this season of conversion, for the grace to recognize the gaze of Christ in those who are suffering and to respond to his invitation to share in his Cross. In this way, the Church on Long Island will grow together with Our Lord in grace.




Your baby is about 16-20" long and weighs between 4 - 9 pounds. With only one month to go, a layer of fat is produced and stored beneath the skin, for both insulation and as a food supply. Antibodies that give immunity to diseases are building up. The amniotic fluid is totally replaced every three hours, and the baby absorbs a gallon of it every day, more if the fluid sweetened! Your baby pumps 300 gallons of blood per day and the placenta begins to age. The center of the baby's bones are still hardening, but the bones in the head are soft and flexible for delivery. Even though your baby could survive outside the womb at this point without much medical help, it is still legal to abort him or her for any reason! Please keep praying for the baby's mother, that she will trust in God and be graced with a loving, generous and courageous heart and bring her baby to a live birth.
